

Materials guideline list

Thank you for your interest in [Form to Freedom – Weaving for Fibre Sculpture with Harriet Goodall](#). Here, you'll find some pre-registration advice as an essential guide for what you'll need to complete this course. Once enrolled, detailed material lists with images and supplier recommendations will be available in the resource guide documents.

Just to let you know, this document serves as a general guide. We encourage resourcefulness and using what you already have before considering new material purchases. If you have any specific questions about materials, feel free to contact support@taketwoart.com.

Equipment:

- **Sharp secateurs**
- **Scissors**
- **Water spray bottle**
- **Garden gloves** for foraging natural materials
- **Yarn needles with a large eye** – one blunt for looping/one sharp for coiling
- **Large tub for water**
- **Old towels**
- **Soft crafting wires**

Helpful tools:

- Small **jewellers pliers**
- **Basketry awl**
- **Butane torch**

From your environment:

- **Harvested vines** of assorted widths, stripped and coiled into loose wreaths
- **Collected ephemera** (feathers, shells, seed pods, etc.)
- Smooth **branches or driftwood**

Random weaving supplies:

- **Round rattan/reed** (One-pound coil or 1/2 kg of 3mm or #5 – can be found at most basketry supply stores)

Random weaving can also be attempted with foraged vines.

Open paired twining:

Fish Trap style basket:

- **Raffia pollot** (50g or a few strands)
- **Round rattan/reed** (one coil of 2mm or #3)
- **Flat Rattan** (one coil – Harriet uses 9mm or 3/8" in the demonstration, but you can make this with any size you can source).

Any flat strips, such as flat cardboard or recycled packing tape, can be used if flat Rattan is unavailable.

Looping:

- **Empty shampoo bottle or pool noodle** for looping around
- **Assorted strings:** Hemp, paper twine, jute or linen thread

These are available through various craft suppliers and Spotlight, etc. There is no best or correct amount, but they usually come in small rolls. String Harvest has a great selection online.

Coiling:

- **Raffia** – plain or coloured (You can usually find Raffia from your local craft supplier, which you can dye yourself or purchase already dyed.)
- **Air-dried clay** (500 grams can be fun to make pinch pots to coil onto)
